SLIDE-3

- In the USA responsibility and liability is divided as follows:
 - The employer whose employees were exposed to the hazard (Exposing Employer)
 - The employer who actually created the hazard (Creating Employer)
 - The employer who was responsible by contract or through actual practice, for the safety and health conditions on the worksite (Controlling Employer)
 - The employer who had the responsibility for actually correcting the hazard (Correcting Employer)

- An effective contractor safety program includes the following:
 - Written program
 - Pre qualification
 - Program evaluation (written program, training)
 - Statistical evaluation (injury & illness statistics, safety violations)
 - Purchase order language
 - Contractor site safety orientation
 - EHS Handbook
 - On site inspection & oversight
 - Permits
 - Disciplinary action or Project shutdown protocol
